
Bonus: Your completed budget worksheets will show your parents that you are organized and responsible. They will be so impressed, they may even chip in extra funds!




What To Wear?

Dress Shopping Time Line Guide



5 months before Prom: Preliminary Shopping

- Start looking in magazines and online.
- Save your faves.




4 months before Prom: Information Gathering

- Check your saved favorites for trends that suit you. Are they all short? Are they all green? If yes, then you are most likely looking for a short, green dress. Knowing this in advance will save you tons of time at the stores.
- If you're still unsure about what you're looking for, check with a bestie for advice or input.
- Check your school's dress code to see if there are certain styles you should avoid before you spend your money.



3 months before Prom: Time to Shop!

- Check out dress boutiques, department stores, second-hand shops and the internet.
- Try it on. Not only will you get an indication of your size, but you may find green is not your color after all, or your legs look frightful in a short dress. Remember, it is easier to alter a dress that is too big, than one that is too small.
- If you've found a dress that fits your budget and makes you feel beautiful and confident, buy it!



2 months before Prom: Alterations vs. Returns

- If your dress is too big in some areas, but fits perfectly in others, you may want to consider alterations. Most dress stores offer this service or you may prefer a tailor.
- If your dress is too small or way too big, you'll probably want to return it for a different size.



Look Your Best In Your Dress

Begin a health and fitness regime (if you don't have one already!) at least 6 months before Prom. Consult a doctor, personal trainer or nutritionist for best results.



Transportation Information

What Should I Know?

When most of us hear the phrase “Prom transportation,” one word jumps to mind: limo. If the traditional is not for you, then be sure to check out our list of creative ways to arrive at Prom. But whether you choose to go the limo route, or partake in a different way to arrive on the scene, here are some must-knows for any transportation rental.

Transportation Time Line Guide

5 months before Prom: Preliminary Shopping

- Decide what type of transportation fits you. Turn to the next page for ideas.
- Based on the type of transportation you choose, figure out how many people will be riding with you. Remember: the more people included, the more ways you can split the bill!
- Call a few different places and ask about their services and prices. Visit their websites. Make sure to get a list of everything included so you know what you are paying for. If possible, go and see your ride in person to make sure you get what you want.

4 months before Prom: Book It

- Be informed. Request a copy of the company’s rental contract and cancellation policy.
- Confirm the amount of people who will be riding with you. Gather money if necessary. Most companies will require a deposit of 25%-35% of your total bill.
- Book your ride! Be sure to get a reservation number.

3 weeks before Prom: Confirm

- Confirm your reservation. Be ready to provide your reservation number.
- Touch base with your group of riders to make sure everyone is still in on the plan.



Influence Your Prom’s Theme

Got ideas for YOUR Prom? Don’t sit back and let someone else make all the decisions for you. Join your Prom Committee and let your voice be heard. Most committees start meetings about 5-7 months before Prom.

This is just the tip of the iceberg! We know if you put your mind to it, you can come up with tons of creative ways to get to Prom. Good luck and be safe!




Hair, Makeup, Nails Time Line Guide


4 months before Prom: Preliminary Shopping

- Start looking through magazine and online.
- Save your faves.



3 months before Prom: Book It

- Call a few salons for pricing and services. You may want to get your hair, makeup and nails done at the same place.
- Schedule a practice appointment for your hair and makeup. Bring pictures of your favorite styles.
- If you're happy with your practice appointment, book an appointment for the day of Prom.



2 months before Prom: DIY Shop & Play

- If you are going to do your own hair, makeup and nails, start shopping for materials and practice. It might help to enlist the help of a friend.



2 weeks before Prom: Confirm

- Confirm your appointment with the salon.
- Purchase what you need to do your hair, makeup and nails.

Other Beauty Services

Tanning

- Try a spray tan or self tanner. Practice before the big night.
- If you use a tanning bed or the sun, start 6 months before Prom and be sure to use sunscreen.

Waxing

- If you choose to wax facial hair, schedule your appointment for a day or two before to avoid redness or swelling on Prom night.



Accessories Checklist

Dining Guide

Need Reservations?

Choosing the right cuisine and atmosphere are the fun parts, but you also need to make sure the prices fit your budget and you will be able to get a table at the right time on the Big Night.

Dining Time Line Guide



4 months before Prom: What's For Dinner

- Figure out how many people will be dining with you. Group of friends or intimate dinner for two?
- Discuss and choose your cuisine. Make sure it fits your budget and those of your fellow diners.



3 months before Prom: Information Gathering

- Read restaurant reviews in your local newspaper or online. Make sure to check out some reviews from real people, not just critics. Ask some recent grads where they went before Prom. Get recommendations from your parents and their friends.
- Go to some places that got good reviews and recommendations and have your choice of cuisine. Make sure it is clean and accommodating with the atmosphere you are seeking.



2 months before Prom: Book It!

- Once you find a restaurant that meets your criteria, make a reservation.
- Be prepared with information on when you'd like to arrive, when you need to leave and how many people will be in your party. Mention any other special accommodations your group may require.
- Ask for and listen to their advice. If you have to leave the restaurant at a certain time, perhaps they can suggest a more appropriate time for arrival. Ask if gratuity is included on the bill so you can be prepared.



2 weeks before Prom: Confirm

- Call the restaurant to make sure they are still holding your reservation. Ask any last minute questions you may have.

- Confirm restaurant reservation.
- Order boutonniere for your date.

1 day before Prom

- Charge your phone and camera.
- Pack your purse.
- Get spray tan and/or waxing.
- Try everything on to make sure your look is complete.
- Get a good night's sleep.
